Presidents Report

Well this season was a difficult one. No access to our surf club, it was being refurbished & extensions happening all summer. Our members lived out of containers & site shed for lifesaving, the juniors operated out of a couple of gear trailers & tents, we trained our members as best we could at the beach, under tents & at sponsors premises, club meetings took place at sponsors locations, surf sports training based out of car parks, private premises set up as gyms, what a committed effort to continue as a surf lifesaving club. It was challenging but we managed to complete the season in great style.

To the **Board of Directors, Management Committee**, varying working committees plus members that helped during the season your efforts were outstanding. I think I mentioned at Presentation Night 'extraordinary people doing extraordinary things'.

Thank you to everybody that contributed to this Annual Report, it is another great read of what we did in season 2016-2017. Special thanks to Sean Taylor for his tireless work to put this Annual Report together.

And by the way our **Life Saving** 104 years strong with no lives lost whilst our members patrolled the beach, what an outstanding record we have. Be proud to wear the red & yellow colours whilst on patrol, it is known all around the world, a valued community service that we provide. Scott Gordon & Markus Meier-Lindner lead the way on our commitment to lifesaving. To every member that pulled on the red & yellow colours to assist with patrols this past season well done.

Again, I thank every member that put their hand up to assist in any role within the club, you play an important role in our development as a surf lifesaving club. With a new constitution & by-laws approved our Executive Committee now known as our Board of Directors increased in numbers from 6 to 8. The 2 new roles/guys were Jamie Caldwell (Director of Education) & Barry Lowe (Director of Surf Sports). Both played a big role in the governance of our club whilst utilising their specialized skills within their respective section of the surf club.

Our **Education** team led by Jamie Caldwell made sure that skills maintenance sessions (proficiency's) were informative and up to date with any new lifesaving skills/methods. Courses were run on a needs basis so to not over burden our education team. This season a Surf Rescue Certificate course happened on Sunday mornings whilst nipper activities were on, capturing our U13/U14 kids who were eligible to obtain this award. From all report's this was a great success and has already been placed in the calendar for next season.

Surf Sports remains a strength of the club. A detailed summary of our surf sports results is further into the Annual Report. A couple of standouts for me personally were the great results at the SLSNSW & SLSA Pool Rescue Championships, overall performances by our juniors at the SLSNSW Age Championships, our U15 Female Surf Team winning the bronze medal at State, the Open Men's Boat Crew fourth consecutive SLSNSW gold medal & Kaimana Fittock collecting a bronze medal at the SLSA Youth Championships in the U15 Female Iron-person.

Junior Activities Section worked really hard this past season given the position we were in with the building project. Be proud of their efforts with Shawn van Duin, Patrick Crittenden & Ian Timbrell leading the way with many helping hands contributing in club activities.

Our **community involvement** continues with our club hosting events & members contributing to all of the activities mentioned, namely Woonona Bowling Club Heart Foundation & Cancer Council Charity Bowls Day, Sea Cliff Ocean Paddle, Shannon Eckstein Nipper Clinic, Club Bowls Day Boat Fundraiser, SLSI Riding the Wave Special Needs Program, Illawarra Motor Neurone Disease Walk, EnVie Fitness Kids Fun Run & SLSI Blood Bank Drive.

Greg Miller Administrator of the Year, Sean Taylor Junior Age Manager of the Year, Jamie Caldwell Education Trainer of the Year, Glenn Sweeny Surf Sports Coach of the Year, our Open Men's Boat Crew Surf Sports Team of the Year (Shane Geloven, Dean Roberts, Heath Mercer, Ben Lowe & Fraser Worthington) & Holly Holmesby Junior Athlete of the Year. High Commendation's also went to Lucas Ottaway Junior Athlete of the Year, Kaimana Fittock Young Athlete of the Year & Max Vercoe Young Life Saver of the Year just to top the night off.

Presentation Night hosted by our own Nathan Flint as MC went off well, over 110 members & guests coming along to enjoy the night. The DVD's produced were great & I thank Ingrid Cardillo for her time & effort over many years to continually produce these for presentation night, it will become part of our history and they will be great to look back on in years to come. Well done to our 3 major award winners on the night Club Person Markus Meier-Lindner, wow 3rd consecutive season, a club record, U19 Club Person Max Vercoe & U16 Club Person Kaimana Fittock. Our surf club building, hasn't it been interesting watching the development happen before your eyes over the past 12 months (some may say an obsession lol). The refurbishment & extensions have taken longer than expected, frustrating at times for our building committee when dealing with various stakeholders.

Stage 1 of the project was a refurbishment of our current building and also extensions on the southern side of the existing building. How good does it look, over 7 years of hard work getting to this stage. \$640K we have contributed to Stage 1 of the project.

We still have Stage 2 to go, which is complete fit out of the extension, basically upstairs which will see disabled lift access, secretary's office, commercial kitchen, toilets (including disabled), storage area for table & chairs, audio visual system for training & education plus seating for 80-100 people for functions, training, education & meetings. More fundraising, sponsorship and grants will need to be applied for. Have you contributed to our 'Buy a Brick' program, funds going directly into Stage 2 of the project, if you want to know more about this please contact Sean Taylor or myself.

This has been a massive achievement for our members, the improved facilities will put us in good stead for the future.

I would like to thank Sharon Bird (Federal Member for Cunningham \$20K), Lee Evans (State Member for Heathcote \$33K) & Ryan Park (State Member for Keira \$40K) for funding in successful grants, SLSNSW for the \$350K Surf Club Facility Grant. Lord Mayor Gordon Bradbery & his councillors for seeing that it was an important project for the community in the northern suburbs. It wasn't easy, many sleepless nights for some of us, countless meetings, emails & lobbying, finally Wollongong City Council committing to the project and approving same. To Project Co-ordination Pty Ltd thank you for what you have produced for us, a quality improved facility.

As always to my lovely wife Maria, thank you for putting up with me but also what you put into the club, many hours behind the scenes work.

Of course this would also not be possible without the support of our great sponsors & supporters so please support our sponsors whenever you have the chance.

I would like to thank Paul Hennessy for his assistance as Administration Officer. Thank you to Maria Caldwell, Markus Meier-Lindner and Junior Committee members Shawn van Duin, Pat Crittenden, Renee Sharman, Lynette Kirkland & Carmen van Duin for their assistance in making sure we meet our compliance requirements with SLSA, SLSNSW and Illawarra Branch. Behind the scenes these people make sure our registrations, transfers, proficiencies, patrols, Incident reports, education, awards and carnival entries are all completed allowing our members to Patrol our beach and compete in surf sports competition.

Even though our lifesaving worked out of two shipping containers for the season we completed our 104th year with no lives lost whilst on Patrol at Bulli Beach. Scott Gordon, Jamie Thorpe, Nathan Flint, Markus Meier-Lindner, Gary Arnold & Jamie Caldwell doing a great job making sure our members were proficient & ready for any challenge presented to them on Patrols. Special mention to Brayden Byrne, Max Vercoe & Belinda Elliott who were recognized with a club citation at Presentation Night for a rescue they did after their Patrol had finished for the day.

The clubs monetary contribution to the renovations did not stop us from updating our lifesaving equipment. The club was successful obtaining a 50-50 grant from BRP Grants Program to update our SSV. We also purchased a new IRB motor through the Beach Safety Equipment Grant & purchased new radios through the Lifesaving Equipment Grant. Thank you to BRP Grants Program for their assistance to our club in purchasing lifesaving equipment. Thank you also to the Federal & State Governments & Local Members, Sharon Bird & Ryan Park for their support during the season. Thanks also to Susan, Zan & other members of the SLSA Grants Unit who have been assisting us with our grant submissions.

We were 100% compliant with SLSA, SLSNSW and SLSI patrol reporting requirements. We scored 100% in announced & unannounced Patrol Audits and finished 2nd in SLSI Awards for Patrolling Club of the Year.

Weather played a big part in this years Surf Sports calendar with events at Illawarra Branch, NSW Championships & Aussies cancelled due to dangerous surf & poor weather conditions. Our Juniors continued to have great results at NSW & Aussie Pool Rescue Championships. We were declared Illawarra Surf Sports Club of the Year with our Juniors winning their point score & our seniors scoring enough points prior to the weather intervening at the Illawarra Branch Carnival. Our boat crews had another great season with more details later in this report. Thank you to all our coaches & officials for your hard work helping our athletes achieve these outstanding results.

After moving the date due to weather conditions we held the Seacliff Ocean Paddle for our third year. (70 paddlers took part this year). 50 nippers attended the Shannon Eckstein Nipper Clinic in January and many members assisted with The Riding the Wave Program. Club Members also supported The Motor Neurone Walk, Envie Fitness Fun Run and the Annual Charity Bowls Day.

Congratulations to awards winners from this seasons club Presentation Night. Thank you to Ingrid Cardillo for her work on the DVD Presentation of our clubs achievements for the year.

Congratulations to our members who were successful with awards at SLSI Awards of Excellence and good luck at SLSNSW Awards.

We hope to announce very soon the dates we can move back in to the clubhouse.

Thanks to Wes Lonergan, Lincoln Costello, Keith Caldwell and Eden Taylor for their contribution with the majority of photographs and reports for the annual report.

Director of Finance Report



The building works have brought about many challenges for the club and it has been great to witness the dedication of our club members in dealing with these and getting on with the job. Financially this has been a big year for the club. The building works has meant a step change in flows in and out of the club of grants, donations, fundraising and payments to Council. Throughout the year, funds were consolidated across our various sections in a co-ordinated effort to ensure we capitalised on the benefits of grants through enhanced interest income.

At the beginning of the season our goal was to complete stage 1 of works with approximately \$60K in the bank, allowing us considerable headroom to ensure all club responsibilities are met and to provide us with a platform to move into Stage 2 building works. I am pleased to report that we achieved this goal, with \$97K on hand at 31 May 2017. The club will be required to fund a further \$25K (net of rebates) to Council on completion of Stage 1 in September.

Over the 12 months to 31 May 17, our cash position decreased ~\$122K, reflecting the club's contribution of to the building works.

The committee would like to thank all our members who have donated their time to assist in our fundraising activities. Including donations and sponsorships, our main activities including the Bulli Workers Club raffle, Christmas raffle, Sportsman's Lunch and Sea Cliff ocean paddle contributed almost \$100K, almost 100% more than last year. A special mention must go to our long standing principal sponsor, the Bulli Workers Club, without whose support our club could not serve the community as robustly as it does.

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(e) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

(g) Investments

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Another very successful patrol season lies behind us - the Club's 104th with no lives lost while on patrol. Thank you very much to all patrolling members for volunteering their time, for their professionalism and for applying their great skills to keep visitors at Bulli Beach safe.

Next to all skills we are applying on the beach and next to all equipment we are using our IRBs and the SSV are critical pieces of life saving equipment. There were quite a few challenges as patrol teams had to perform their duties without the old yellow SSV for about one month due to a breakdown of the rear RH side axle assembly. Topping it all off was the need to run the club and its lifesaving operations out of two containers due to the expansion and refurbishment of the club house. For the coming season we will go onto the starting line with a new Can Am Defender SSV (thanks to BRP Grant Program for our successful SSV Grant), a new IRB motor (thanks the Federal Governments Beach Safety Equipment Grant), two new digital radios ... and a new club house.

Thank you to Ray Disibio at Practic Automotive for his support servicing and repairing the SSV as well as Pauline Spiteri and Amir Fard at Hi Tech Marine for looking after our IRB motors.

Education Report



Another outstanding Surf Life Saving season completed that once again sees our club undertake all activities & operations across all fields of Surf Life Saving!

Our main club goal of continuing on the tradition of 'No lives lost whilst Bulli SLSC members are on patrol' is 104 years strong & continues into next season our 105th! This is a massive achievement that all club members should be proud of, both past & present!

A particular difficult season with not having an operational clubhouse due to our ongoing building development, but in true Bulli style this small little issue did not stop the spirit & enthusiasm of all our members! From an education point of view not having a building this season did make things harder. Majority of our courses do have theory components within course content requiring at times classroom style sessions. We tackled this issue in a number of ways, we had access to a training room in the Wollongong CBD & at times also ran sessions under pop up tents in the park. It was a challenge at times from a logistics point of view, but we got there in the end!

Guys train so hard and make so many sacrifices to have a chance to win an Aussie gold medal and to have it just cancelled is unbelievable. It is pretty hard to image any other sport simply cancelling it's national championships. At a time when there is a national trend away from the sport it defies logic. The effort to keep young people in the movement can be tiring (particularly away from Sydney) and there seems to be little acknowledgement of the issues facing regional and country clubs. Changes are underway at competitor level which will hopefully assist in the attraction and retention of young people whilst also ensuring that this situation does not happen again. The good news is that Bulli remain the reigning open boat champions!

Rather than dwell on the obvious negative, the season has been another great success. The Bulli "A" crew of Shane Geloven, Dean Roberts, Heath Mercer, Ben Lowe and Fraser Worthington swept all before them to win the Ocean Thunder series, the South Coast Boat series, the NSW state titles and were given the opportunity to represent the State. The second A crew (Paul Jones, Damien Clark, Dan Porra, Mitch Roberts and Adam Barlow) fell one race short of earning the right to represent Australia going down 2-1 to Avoca in the head-to-head final series. Ultimately both open crews finished in the top five of the newly establish national ranking series with the "A" crew taking top spot. Almost every Open boat final this year featured two Bulli crews, a feat that we should be proud of.

The under 23s crew (Barry Lowe, Albert Smeaton, Kyle Mercer, Isaak Lunney and Lachlan O'Grady) raced the season in outstanding fashion. As the Patrol Captain on the day Markus made sure that team members were debriefed and were aware of all support avenues available. He made personal follow up phone calls to all members in the days after the event to ensure they were ok.

In addition to the above day-to-day patrol operations Markus puts in a lot of hours that are not recorded anywhere. He has done many things – often behind the scenes - that the club as a whole has benefited from:


