Director of Administration Report

Members,

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Bulli Surf Life Saving Club, I am pleased to present for adoption, the 106th Annual Report and Financial Statement for Season 2018-19. I propose to be brief in my report rather than repeat what has already been said by our Directors throughout the report. I do need to thank Keith and Maria Caldwell as well as the Club Directors and Office Bearers not only for providing such detailed information for inclusion in this report but also for their support of myself, and for their involvement in what has been another successful season for our Club. The sense of ownership of their respective portfolios exuding from those Directors and Officer Bearers only lends itself to a successful organization.

It has certainly been an exciting Season, particularly since last October with the successful completion of our Club's building project. I cannot thank Mr Craig Parsons from LDJ Group enough for his involvement in our Club's building project. With the support of generous members and other donors, we now have a venue we should be very proud of and which should be very beneficial to our Club both culturally and financially. Four (4) Sunday sipper functions were held, all being well attended and enjoyable. Function room hire by community groups, schools, fitness providers and individuals has been reasonably steady despite us not promoting its availability in the wider community.

A couple of changes only were made to the make-up of the Executive Committee following last year's AGM leading to minimal disruption to the conduct of Club business. A total of four (4) Committee Meetings and two (2) General Meetings were conducted throughout the season with a range of minor business being conducted via email. Meeting attendance by Committee Members was on the whole, very good.

The Club maintained its governance and remains compliant with legislation, including requirements under Liquor Licensing, Fair Trading, SLSNSW, SLSA and the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission. With "Good Sports", we approved and implemented an Illegal Drugs policy. The **Safeguarding Children and Young People** Program became a focus for our Club with our Member Services Officer Rebecca Colquhoun leading the way in our commitment to the protection of our young members from abuse, harm and exploitation.

Finally, it is pleasing to see and report that all Office Holders will be returning for another Season. I look forward to working with them and our members in what is going to be a very busy Season 2019/20.

Director of Finance Report

Financially, this has been another big year for the club. The completion of Stage 2 (upstairs Function Room) building works and the introduction of events and venue hire in this facility, has meant heightened cash flows in and out of the club.

The Function Room, completed in November 2018 came in on budget. I'd like to acknowledge the work of Craig Parsons from LDJ Group and member of Bulli SLSC for his drive project managing the works. The works were largely funded by a \$348K SLS NSW Surf Club Facility Grant and generous donations of time and money by our members and their companies. This generosity was immortalised in the "Buy-a-Brick" honour board as you enter the Function Room.

The Grant, secured last year, was drawn upon throughout construction as works were completed and first paid for by Bulli SLSC. This meant careful programming of works and cash flow management for which I thank the Management Committee for their understanding of the financial constraint this placed on the club throughout the year.

We have consciously had a slow ramp up to events and hire of the Function Room, whilst we establish best practises to operate the venue and ensure our vision for the facility is met. The vision is twofold: to enhance the social experience for our members of Bulli SLSC and to generate a modest profit stream to deliver enhanced outcomes across all our club activities. Function Room hire contributed \$8K in FY19. With it being open for less than half a year and without the time to secure planned events, this will increase significantly next season.

We are very fortunate at Bulli Surf Club to have many great supporters and volunteering members. The Committee would like to thank all our members who have donated their time to assist in our fundraising activities including donations and sponsorships, our main activities - Bulli Workers Club raffle, Christmas events, Buy-a-brick and social functions contributed approx. \$130K for the year. A special mention must go to our long standing principal sponsor, the Bulli Workers Club, without whose support our club could not serve the community as robustly as it does.

Over the 12 months to 31 May 2019, our cash position increased* to a healthy ~\$185K. This will enable us to invest in our community services and our members' experience. Already planned for next season is an upgrade to the First Aid room; a refresh of our nipper boards to complement the numbers in each age group; an upgrade to the gym and its facilities; and a new surf boat which has been pre-funded.

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(e) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

(g) Investments

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

Another very successful patrol season lies behind us - the Club's 106th without lives lost while on patrol. Thank you very much all patrolling members and other volunteers for their time, their professionalism and for applying their great skills to keep visitors at Bulli Beach safe.

Just how good the past season was shows this summary:

- A record 99% success rate of having a full and compliant patrol team at the start of each shift without any 'last minute scrambling' (79 out of 80 shifts)
- Decrease of number of members with 'no-show' hours by -50%
- Increase of number of members with substitute hours by 45%
- Above successes despite a decrease in the patrolling membership of -7.1%
- The ratio of rescues per preventative actions has increased for a third consecutive year by 17% this time following a 11% increase (2016/17 to 2017/18) and a 217% increase (2015/16 to 2016/17)
- Maximum number of patrolling hours of any member during 2018/19 was 93, indicating a 'better sharing of the load' and a big improvement from the previous season
- 22 patrolling members did 50 patrol hours or more
- The Operations App was used consistently by all patrol teams from the start of the season
- There were no patrolling related incidents or injuries of any patrolling members
- There were no significant equipment related problems during the entire season

2018 – 2019 was a big year for Bulli Surf Sports competitors. With the completion of the club house and associated racks / storage systems, the members moved their equipment back into Bulli surf club which enabled the competitors and coaches to concentrate their efforts into training and racing.

The club appointed several key personnel as coaches and our athletes (both junior and senior) flourished. The Junior club training / coaches are providing a great foundation for the younger competitors and our senior club has over the last couple of years started to benefit from the time and effort put into the juniors.

At the NSW state titles this year, Bulli finished 12th in the overall point score for the senior state and the juniors placed 17th in the overall point score. For a small club, this is an absolute fantastic result.

A special mention for Bulli's open boat crew who claimed their 6th consecutive open state GOLD medal.

To surf sports, Bulli were again well represented in the competition department during the 2018/19 season.

Throughout the year Bulli Surf Club competed in a number of events, Sydney Water Surf Series, South Coast Boat Series and Ocean Thunder Boat Series, claiming wins in some of these prestigious events.

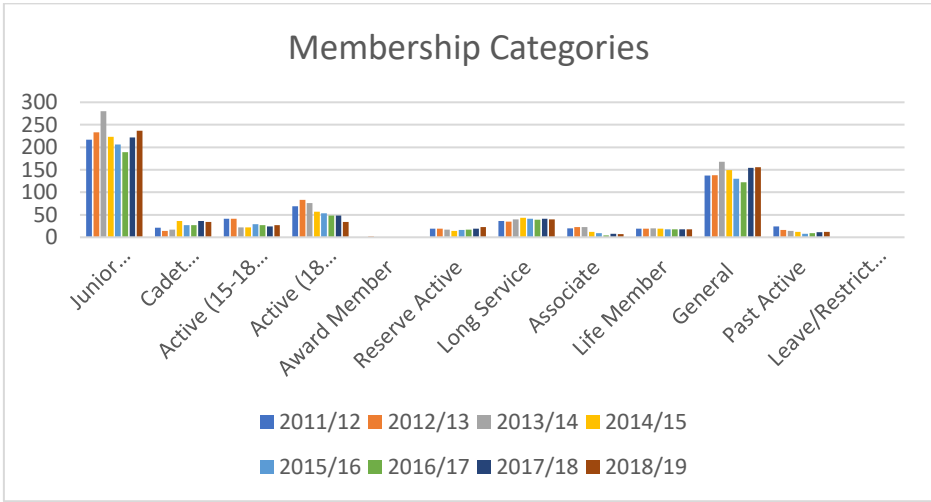

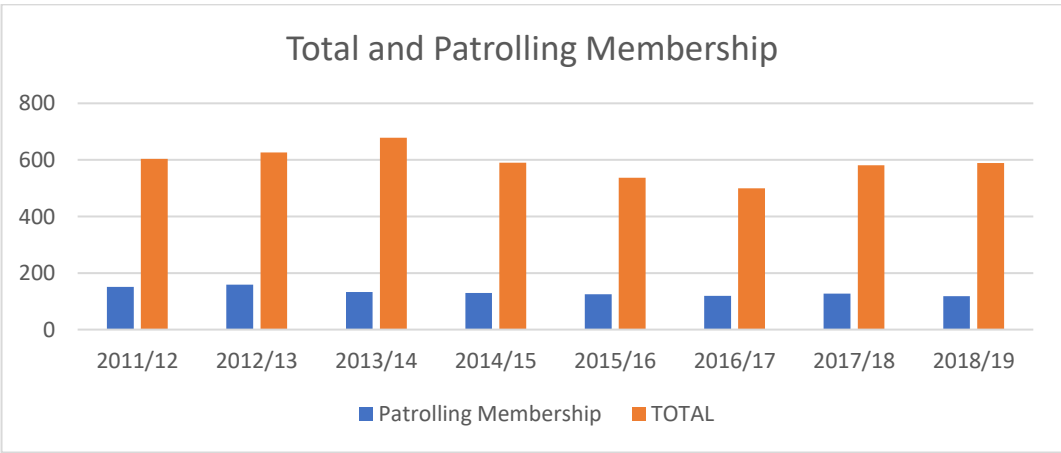
