## DEPUTY PRESIDENT

This may be the first, and hopefully the last, Deputy President report in Bulli SLSC's history to lead an Annual Report and it is because this season has been one of both triumph and tragedy. On Sunday 2nd May and again on Thursday 27th May 2021, Keith Caldwell (President) and I discussed at length that we had probably just witnessed one of the best seasons in the club's history. Though neither of us were prepared for the days that followed those conversations.

Let us at least start with our triumphs! Our total club membership grew in the 2020/21 season by just over seven percent to 713 financial members. We also continued to remain in a strong fiscal situation even in spite of the COVID-19 pandemic which makes it increasingly hard to secure corporate sponsorship. I want to make a special thanks to the many dozens of sponsors that continue to support the club in times of hardship. Your continued support allows this club to be a beacon for others in the region. Many of you would know that our Director of Finance, Greg Miller, left us at the beginning of 2021 to start an exciting new profession as a teacher in the Northern Territory. Greg has served most competently in this role for many years now and we thought his skills would be difficult to replace. That said, we were blessed when Casey Primmer seamlessly filled the role and has been an asset to our Management Committee since Greg's departure. We also need to thank Paul Hennessy for not only keeping the administrative works of the club intact, but through his ongoing support of club events and venue hire over the last 12 months. Again, COVID-19 presented some challenges, but Paul has ensured that our club remains steadfast

Of the 713 members who served our club this year, 304 were junior activities members which represents one of the largest junior cohorts and increases we have had in recent memory. I want to thank Adam Barlow (Director of Junior Activities) and his many helpers (of which there are far too many to mention by name) for nurturing and encouraging the next generation of Bulli Surf Lifesavers.

Our lifesaving and education teams, ably led by Markus Meier-Lindner, Jamie Thorpe, and Jamie Caldwell did an amazing job of standing up to the challenge of our busiest season on record in terms of visitor numbers, preventative actions, and actual rescues. The Australia Day Long-Weekend of 2021 presented the most frenetic period of lifesaving operations for our club in recent memory. Our humble little family club here

on the Northern Beaches of the Illawarra also did more than its fair share of support to other clubs in the region. Not only did we maintain a highly commended Emergency Callout Team consisting of 20 members, but we also had members conduct Patrol Audits, participate in Support Operations, and act as Duty Officers for our Branch.

Surf Sports once again remained a highlight for many of us this season. Our performances at Branch, State and the Australian Titles were extraordinary. We hauled in a massive total of over 150 medals at the Illawarra Branch Championships. This laid the solid groundwork for a successful SLSNSW State Championships whereby Bulli SLSC finished 9th in the overall point score with 14 medals. At the Australian National Titles we also punched well above our weight securing 11 medals and finishing 19th overall. I want to extend a heartfelt thanks to Michael Locke (Director of Surf Sports), Dean Roberts (Boat Captain), our coaches, and all our competitors for doing us so proud.

Of course, the tragedy of losing Keith suddenly on 30th May 2021 has wounded the very soul of Bulli SLSC. Very few clubs have to grieve the loss of a standing President, especially one so young and full of life. Let alone one who had served for the last 17 seasons in the role. Keith and I would often say that "No one person is greater than the club". We would often reflect on this statement during our deliberations of club matters and whilst it may be true, I believe it is fair to say that "No one person has had a greater impact on our club than Keith Caldwell". He leaves behind a legacy that far exceeds something I can hope to articulate in this Annual Report. We must all continue to do the one thing that Keith role modelled for all Bulli SLSC members, and that is to champion others ahead of ourselves. People will continue to be drawn to our surf club because they feel we will have your back regardless of what life throws your way. The community thinks we only save those from drowning on our beach (for 108 years with no lives lost whilst on patrol mind you). However, most importantly, we save each other from drowning in life.

## VALE

### KEITH ROBERT “COCKY” CALDWELL (1961/2021)



The passing of any club member is a sad occurrence, but when that member is the current President of the club, it has an impact that only time itself will be able to realise. On the 30th of May this year Keith, our President for the past 17 seasons, lost his short battle for life after suffering a number of neurological events surrounded by his most precious family at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Sydney.

Keith joined Bulli SLSC in the mid '70s gaining his Bronze Medallion in season 1976/77 and competed at all levels through to Australian Championships with distinction winning medals in differing events. He was an outstanding craft competitor with an ability to swim with the best, and also proved to be a team player by being a part of the Bulli “Golden” era of R & R through the 80's into the 90's. Keith was rewarded for all his performances by being selected in the NSW Junior (Under 18 yrs) Taplin Relay Team to compete at the Interstate Titles on Trigg Island, WA as one of two board paddlers, helping his team to 1st place.

Keith held many positions within the committee of the club, R & R Captain, Vice Club Captain, Club Captain, Deputy President, and as mentioned, President for an unequalled 17 seasons. He possessed an ability to liaise with people across all walks of life, to build our club to a position of strength through having the right people in the right places, conversing with Politicians to assist in the clubs' endeavours to rebuild our clubhouse, and to sway business people to come on board as club sponsors. His talents across all levels of administration were second to none.



With the effort Keith applied to making our club what it is today, he was awarded Life Membership in season 2007/08. He was actively involved at Branch, State, and Australian levels with the management of various Representative Teams, pulling on the “Green and Gold” on many occasions. Again, his efforts in management and administration in general of our movement, saw Life Membership granted to him from the Illawarra Branch, NSW State, and Australian Life Saving Associations.

The hole left by the passing of Keith will be one which will take time to close. He has left an indelible print on our club, one which is a legacy for Bulli SLSC to maintain in moving forward and continuing to build on the strengths Keith has put in place. Keith is survived by his loving wife Maria, children Jamie and Natalie, and his 4 and a half grandchildren. He will be sadly missed by all. **RIP** WORDS by Noel Freeman

## DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I'm pleased to present the Annual Report of Bulli Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for Season 2020/2021. The events of a successful, yet challenging twelve months were overshadowed by the passing of our long-term President and great mate, Keith "Cocky" Caldwell. I can only echo the sentiments of others in this report. A sad loss to his family, friends and the Community, the turnout at his funeral testament to that. Our Club has found itself in a strong position for many years, all the better for Keith's leadership. He leaves huge shoes to fill. RIP COCKY.

A Covid safe Annual General Meeting in August 2020 heralded the start of another season with little change to Committee personnel from the previous year. A career change for Director of Finance Greg Miller saw he and his family re-locate to the Northern Territory in December. Thank you Greg for the work you did in that role over several years and we look forward to the Millers coming home and again being involved in our Club. We were fortunate to have Casey Primmer take over from Greg. Casey's knowledge and professionalism ensured a smooth handover and Club finances continue to be managed appropriately.

Despite the ever-present threat of Covid-19, Surf Club activities were reasonably unaffected. Membership numbers were up, primarily due to an increase in nipper registrations and one or both of their parents registering under the "General" category. Club Patrols, Lifesaving courses and "Nippers" went ahead, and the vast majority of Surf Sports events were as per program. Speaking of Covid, thank you to Maria Caldwell for keeping abreast of the ever-changing Covid restrictions and for ensuring Bulli Surf Club remained compliant and its members as Covid safe as possible – preparation of Covid safety plans, the provision of Covid packs and sanitiser, the installation of QR code scanning and legislated signage.

December 2020 saw enough Covid restrictions eased to allow social events to recommence in our Function Room. Surf Club sippers and public events including birthdays, engagement parties, corporate training days and even a charity "comedy night" were conducted. The room has also proven to be a popular venue for pilates and yoga groups providing a steady little

income.



Our strike rate with grant applications continues to be good. The past season has seen us install a solar panel system with a Tesla battery and much needed cupboard space in the ground floor club room, funding assistance coming from the Surf Club Facility Program. We were also able to acquire a brand new Can-Am Defender ATV through the BRP Equipment Grant and a new defibrillator with assistance from the Office of Sport Local Sport Defibrillator Program. Thanks to Keith and Maria Caldwell for preparing the applications and to Susan Ahmelman and her team at the SLS Foundation Grant Seeking Unit for the final touches and submission. Annual funding from the NSW Government supported Club Lifesaving Equipment Grant and Beach Safety Equipment Fund and the Wollongong Council supported Lifesaving Operations Grant allowed Markus and his Lifesaving Team have our lifesaving resources well stocked and maintained.

Thanks to all who contributed to this report and thanks to all Directors, Committee Members, and those who generously volunteered their time over the past year. I look forward to working with you in the upcoming Season.

## LIFESAVING

Thank You!

Another very successful patrol season lies behind us - the Club's 108th without lives lost while on patrol. Thank you very much all rostered patrolling members and all non-rostered additional volunteers for their time, their professionalism and for applying their skills to keep visitors at Bulli Beach safe.

COVID-19 was still very much around and impacted the delivery of lifesaving services, but despite all this Bulli SLSC keeps delivering great results. Lifesaving services cover two areas – patrols we conduct on Sundays and Public Holidays as well as responses to after hour emergencies and incidents.

The significant increases we have noticed on patrol from the previous season have occurred due to two main reasons 1) the cancellation of the 2019/20 season's patrols effective 27 March 2020 due to COVID-19 and 2) the significant increase in non-local, ocean inexperienced visitors due to National and State border closures and travel restrictions. The latter has been the driver behind skyrocketing numbers in preventative actions and rescues. Below table outlines the last season in some core statistics:

For our Emergency Callout Team it was not an extraordinary high number of incidents that has changed over time, but it is the kind of responses that has changed. Boating accidents seem to become the kind of incidents we get involved in more. Just before 10:30am on 4 July 2021 the Callout Team was activated to support NSWPF and Marine

Rescue in a search for three missing persons. Their boat was reported to have failed to return to Bellambi boat ramp early that morning. Both IRBs were launched as well as RWC 3 and participated in an extensive search. Unfortunately three bodies were discovered, one near Corrimal and two with the overturned boat that was located about 5kms off shore. It was another fast, efficient and professional response of the Callout Team, who are not only continuing to make a good name for themselves, but also for Bulli SLSC as a reliable partner and asset.

Thank you very much to our long-term partners and sponsors, especially Ray Disibio at Practic Automotive for his support servicing and repairing the SSV, Pauline Spiteri and Amir Mazhari at Hi Tech Marine for looking after our IRB motors and Vincent McKay at Cobia Boats for keeping our IRB hulls in good shape.

## EDUCATION

Season 20/21 – the busiest season on record!

The way the world has changed and shaped not only our lives but the lives of our local community and visitors has seen us as a club have to adapt and change not only in the social & community sense but also our Lifesaving Operations, Surf Sports and Junior Activities. This also meant that both formal and informal training and education strategy and methodology had to change and adept as well to meet these new needs.

Further to this, Lifesaving is now an all year round operation from traditional patrols during the patrol season to the 24/7 standby emergency capability we now provide to the community as part of being a part of a broader emergency service landscape being Surf Life Saving NSW. We have seen an increase in after hour activations of our Emergency Call Out Team with the team involved in a number of major incidents in and around the Bulli community. I wish to call out the professionalism and culture of all members involved in all these call outs over the past 12-18 months, they have had significant challenges and not always involved the best outcomes but our people have shown a form of resilience that inspires the upmost confidence.

My philosophy towards training and education is not only to develop and raise the level of frontline lifesaving skills but to also help shape and influence our members in becoming community minded resilient leaders, which I believe we have a very good track record of achieving.

From a proficiency point of view we conducted over 700 proficiencies including all frontline lifesaving qualifications and junior activities members.



In total this year we facilitated and delivered the following qualifications;

- Surf Rescue Certificate – 15
- Bronze Medallion – 18
- Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) - 26 (18 as per BM above, 8 as upgrades from old BM)
- Advanced Resuscitation Techniques – 6
- Silver Medallion Beach Management – 8
- Silver Medallion IRB Driver - 2
- Junior Activities Surf Awareness Awards - 311

Bulli SLSC provided support to both Bellambi and Scarborough Wombarra SLSC, allowing members of each club to participate in a number in courses at Bulli to assist with upskilling of their members.



Further to all this above, we conducted “Exercise Goggles”. The aim of Exercise Goggles was to educate all Emergency Call Out team members, all patrolling members & all junior water safety personnel members on the contents of the Search and Rescue kit & theory of initial response to a submerged and/or missing persons in water and physically test the SAR kit, equipment and the initial response to a submerged missing person situation. This session was attended by 35 Bulli SLSC members plus Wollongong City Council Lifeguards and Surf Life Saving Illawarra Duty Officers.

Bulli SLSC also hosted for all Illawarra SLSC the ALBERT Program on 20 and 21 February 2021. The ALBERT Program (Australian Lifesaving Boat Emergency Rescue Training) enhances skills, experience and confidence of lifesavers through collaborative and consistent training. It utilises a mix of drill-based activities, dedicated coaching and scenario-based training. ALBERT is also an important vehicle to support networking and knowledge sharing between members, Clubs and Branches across the state. Bulli SLSC had a number of members attend this two day workshop. Further to this we held then our own internal IRB driver and crew workshop on Sunday 2nd May which was attend by close to 20 members.

## ENSURING OUR LIFESAVERS ARE CAPABLE & READY

**WHO WE ARE?**

The ALBERT program enhances the skills & experiences of lifesavers through collaborative and consistent training, utilising a mix of drill-based activities, coaching and scenario-based training. 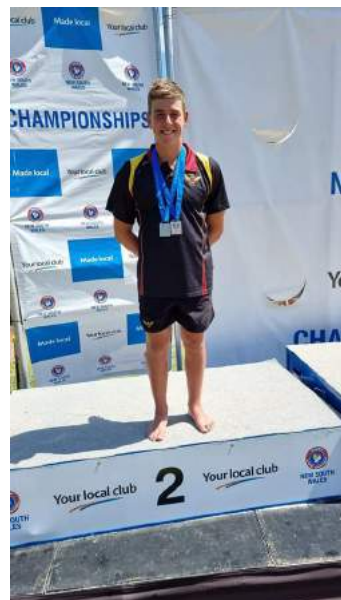

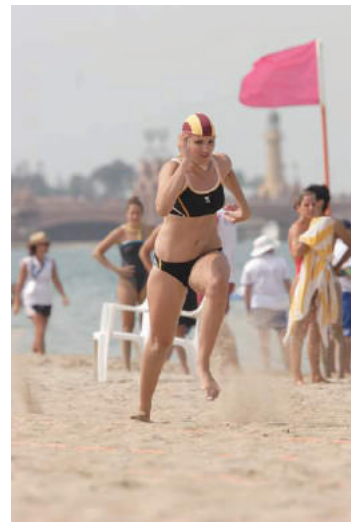

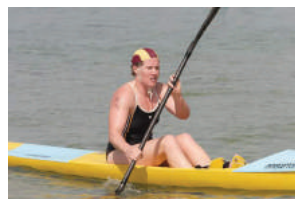

## FINANCE

With the ongoing support of our great sponsors, dedicated volunteers, members and government grants we continue to be in a good financial position. Bulli Surf Club closed the season with over \$160,000 in the bank, after spending over \$117,000 this year on member and community activities and the general running of the club.

Major improvements this year include the installation of security lockers, solar power system and storage cupboards; purchase of new equipment to support lifesaving operations including an IRB Motor, IRB beach trailer and new SSV; a set of oars; a craft trailer; and additional nipper boards.

The above improvements and ongoing running of the club would not be possible without our members and sponsors

who have donated their time and support to our fundraising activities. In addition to donations and sponsorships, fundraising activities for the year included the Bulli Workers Club raffle, nippers BBQs and Christmas events. These activities combined contributed over \$61,000 for the year. Our function room continues to be popular and contributed over \$13,000 this year through both external functions and club social activities.

We are very fortunate at Bulli Surf Club to have many great supporters and volunteering members. A special mention must go to our long standing principal sponsor, the Bulli Workers Club, without whose support our club could not serve the community as robustly as it does.

Unfortunately the impacts of COVID and ongoing restrictions continue to be felt by the club. While government support is being sought where possible, we are fortunate to be in a healthy financial position. This will enable us to continue to serve and support the community through this difficult time.

I look forward to seeing everyone back at the club and on the beach in the near future.

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**Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of Preparation**

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales. In the opinion of the committee the association is not a reporting entity because it is not reasonable to expect the existence of users who rely on the association's general purpose financial statements for information useful to them for making and evaluating decisions about the allocation of resources.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales, the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements, AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, AASB 1031: Materiality and AASB 1054: Australian Additional Disclosures.

The association has concluded that the requirements set out in AASB 10 and AASB 128 are not applicable as the initial assessment on its interests in other entities indicated that it does not have any subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures. Hence, the financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The association has not assessed whether these special purpose financial statements comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

**(a) Accounts Receivables and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are as per effective life

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**(c) Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

**(d) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

**(e) Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

The association has applied AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers (AASB 15) and AASB 1058: Income of Not-for-Profit Entities (AASB 1058) using the cumulative effective method of initially applying AASB 15 and AASB 1058 as an adjustment to the opening balance of equity at 1 July 2019. Therefore, the comparative information has not been restated and continues to be presented under AASB 118: Revenue and AASB 1004: Contributions.

**In the current year**

**Contributed Assets**

The association receives assets from the government and other parties for nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg. AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138).

On initial recognition of an asset, the association recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The association recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

**Operating Grants, Donations and Bequests**

When the association receives operating grant revenue, donations or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the association:

- identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant
- recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the association:

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- recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (eg. AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138)
- recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer)
- recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the association recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

**Capital Grant**

When the association receives a capital grant, it recognises a liability for the excess of the initial carrying amount of the financial asset received over any related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer) recognised under other Australian Accounting Standards.

The association recognises income in profit or loss when or as the association satisfies its obligations under the terms of the grant.

**Interest Income**

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

**Dividend Income**

The association recognises dividends in profit or loss only when the right to receive payment of the dividend is established.

**Income from Sale of Goods**

Revenue is recognised when control of the products has transferred to the customer. For such transactions, this is when the products are delivered to the customers. Volume discounts could be provided with the sale of these items, depending on the volume of aggregate sales made to eligible customers over every six-month period. Revenue from these sales is based on the price stipulated in the contract, net of the estimated volume discounts. The volume discounts are estimated using historical experience and applying the expected value method. Revenue is then only recognised to the extent that there is a high probability that a significant reversal of revenue will not occur. Where there is expected volume discounts payable to the customers for sales made until the end of the reporting period, a contract liability is recognised.

A receivable will be recognised when the goods are delivered. The association's right to consideration is deemed unconditional at this time as only the passage of time is required before payment of that consideration is due. There is no significant financing component because sales (which include those with volume discounts) are made within a credit term of 30 to 45 days.

Customers have a right to return products within 60 days as stipulated in the current contract terms. At the point of sale, a refund liability is recognised based on an estimate of the products expected to be returned, with a corresponding adjustment to revenue for these products.

Consistent with the recognition of the refund liability, the association further has a right to recover the product when customers exercise their right of return so consequently the company recognises a right to returned goods asset and a corresponding adjustment is made to cost of sales.

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Historical experience of product returns is used to estimate of the number of returns on a portfolio level, using the expected value method. It is considered highly probable that significant reversal in the cumulative revenue will not occur given the consistency in the rate of return presented in the historical information.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

**In the comparative period**

Non-reciprocal grant revenue was recognised in profit or loss when the association obtained control of the grant and it was probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant would flow to the entity and the amount of the grant could be measured reliably.

If conditions were attached to the grant which must be satisfied before the association was eligible to receive the contribution, the recognition of the grant as revenue was deferred until those conditions were satisfied.

When grant revenue was received whereby the association incurred an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this was considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue was recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service had been delivered to the contributor; otherwise the grant was recognised as income on receipt.

The association received non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for no or nominal value.

These assets were recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

Donations and bequests were recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue was recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Dividend revenue was recognised when the right to receive a dividend had been established.

Rental income from operating leases was recognised on a straight-line basis over the term of the relevant leases.

Revenue from the rendering of a service was recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customer.

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**(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

**(h) Financial Assets**

**Initial recognition and measurement**

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the association becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. For financial assets, this is equivalent to the date that the association commits itself to either purchase or sale of the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted).

Financial instruments (except for trade receivables) are initially measured at fair value plus transaction costs, except where the instrument is classified “at fair value through profit or loss”, in which case transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Trade receivables are initially measured at the transaction price if the trade receivables do not contain a significant financing component or if the practical expedient was applied as specified in paragraph 63 of AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers.

By default, all other financial assets that do not meet the measurement conditions of amortised cost and fair value through other comprehensive income are subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The association initially designates a financial instrument as measured at fair value through profit or loss if:

The initial measurement of financial instruments at fair value through profit or loss is a one-time option on initial classification and is irrevocable until the financial asset is derecognised.



## VALE

**Brian Bradley (Brad)** was a nipper with the Thirroul Sand Crabs before moving to the Bulli Surf Club and gaining his qualifying Certificate in the 65/66 season. He obtained his Bronze Medallion in the 66/67 season and soon became a member of the Bulli rowing crews. Brad took up sweeping in the 73/74 season where he swept the Bulli Reserve Crew to an Australian final. Although putting significant time into sweeping he continued to row and was part of the inaugural George Bass Marathon crew that was placed 2nd in the 74/75 event.

Bulli Club Championships were a highly competitive event in the 60's and 70's, Brad showed his versatility by winning the Open Beach Flags in the 76/77 season.

Brad successfully swept many crews over the coming years at Bulli winning Branch, State and Australian medals before spending a few years at the Woonona and Thirroul Surf clubs in the late 80's. Brad returned to Bulli and focused on sweeping the veteran crews in the 94/95 season where he entered a crew in the 1997 George Bass Marathon, ultimately winning the veterans event that year, and for many years to come.

It was during the George Bass Marathon in early 2000 that Brad lost balance during the race and fell out of the boat, for no apparent reason. The race doctor advised Brad to get some tests to determine the cause of his unbalance, several months later Brad was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease.

Brad, his wife Sue and family worked with specialists and clinicians over the next two decades to manage the disease as best they could.

Brad was a generous man, both with his time and good will.

He was enthusiastic, reliable, always authentic and fun to be around. He passed away peacefully in the Berry Nursing Home on the 5th May 2021, aged 69 years. *WORDS by Barry Lowe*

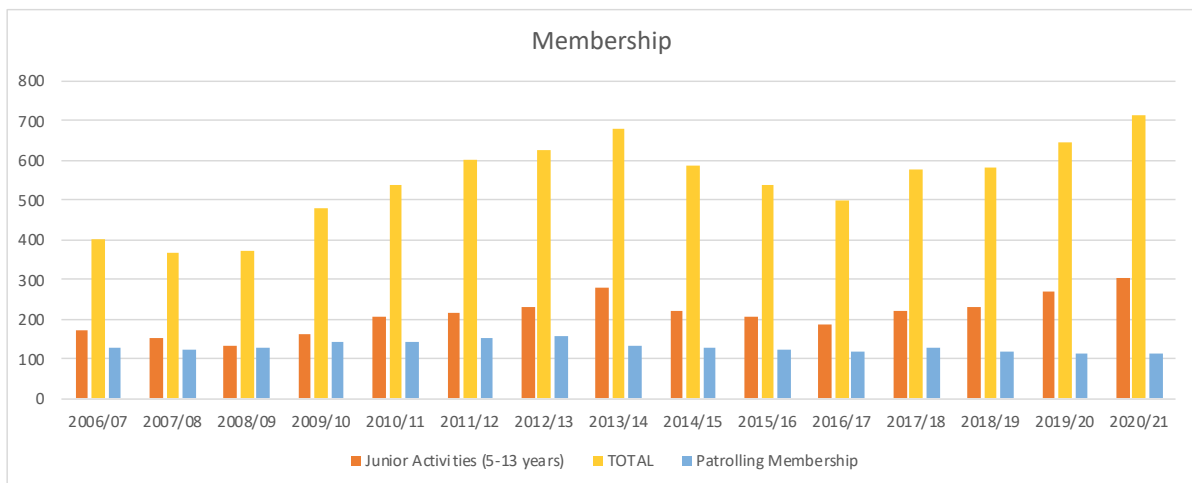
