Stage 2 of our surf building refurbishment & extensions which is the fit out of the extensions upstairs is progressing well. A big thank you to Craig Parsons (junior parent) and Managing Director of LDJ Group for assisting with his expertise as the Surf Club Project Manager. Craig has worked well with the Building Steering Committee budgeting for the works to be completed during season 2018-2019. It is exciting, the disabled lift access to level 1 has been installed, the gym is being restored to its normal capacity, a new state of the art entry access system has been installed. Work continues upstairs and I am sure every member can't wait to see the finished product & have a big official opening of the new and improved Bulli Surf Life Saving Club. Stage 2 upstairs will see disabled lift access, secretary's office, commercial kitchen, toilets (including disabled), storage area for table & chairs, audio visual system for training & education plus seating for 80-100 people for functions, training, education & meetings. Long overdue and much needed improved facilities for our future.

To receive a 2nd bite of the cherry with the 2017-2018 SLSNSW Surf Facility Grant to the tune of \$348,233.00 (special thanks to Gareth Ward Parliamentary Secretary for the Illawarra & South Coast), plus 2017 NSW Community Partnership Grant \$25,000.00 from Ryan Park (State Member for Keira) made our project become a reality, it means not having to do heaps of fundraising & chasing sponsors for the building alone, now we can focus on our bright future.

Special mention to Barry Lowe (Director of Surf Sports) & Scott Gordon (Director of Life Saving) who both won't be seeking re-election next season due to work & family commitments. Barry took on the new role in its first 2 seasons has done a great job managing our surf sports section. Scott has fulfilled his role for 5 seasons continually improving our life saving standard along with his lifesaving team. Thank you to both of you for your service.

Finally, I would like to express my appreciation to every member of the surf club that assisted in any role or committee position within the club, you all play an important role in our development as a surf lifesaving club. Members,

On behalf of the Board of Directors of Bulli Surf Life Saving Club, I am pleased to present for adoption, the 105th Annual Report and Financial Statement for Season 2017-18. It's been at least 20 years since I last prepared such a report for the Bulli Club and I'm not certain that the availability of emails, websites and social media have made this task any easier or less time consuming. I need to thank Keith and Maria Caldwell as well as the Club Directors and Office Bearers not only for providing such detailed information for inclusion in this report but also for their support of myself, and for their involvement in what has been another successful season for our Club. I propose to be brief in my report rather than repeat what has already been said by our Directors throughout the report.

It has certainly been an exciting Season, particularly since December when we were advised the Club had been successful in its application for almost \$350K in funding from the Surf Life Saving NSW Facility Grant. Congratulations to Keith on preparing yet another successful grant application and a huge thanks to Gareth Ward, Parliamentary Secretary for the Illawarra and South Coast for his support of this application. Thanks also to Ryan Park, State Member for Keira for his support in our successful application for funding under the 2017 NSW Community Partnership Grant. Surf Life Saving NSW Foundation Grant's Unit have been a wonderful asset in our pursuit of funding and I extend thanks to Unit Staff.

I cannot thank Mr Craig Parsons from LDJ Group enough for his involvement in our Club's building project. As the Project Manager, his expertise, his patience in dealing with the Club President and myself and his unlimited pool of quality tradesmen and sub-contractors is going to result in a soon to be completed top class training and function area for Club members. That in itself will provide both exciting and sometimes complex issues for the upcoming season with liquor licensing legislative requirements to be met and some tough decisions as to how the function room can be utilized by both membership and community groups alike to ensure it is financially viable, yet primarily for the enjoyment of our membership.

The Bulli Club participated in Surf Life Saving NSW's Quality Club program and were successful in achieving bronze level status. The Quality program assisted me as an Administrator in ensuring the Club strengthened its governance and was compliant with legislation, including requirements under Fair Trading, SLSNSW, SLSA and the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission. It was certainly a worthwhile exercise and leading into a new season, at least silver level status will be sought to ensure that we, as a Club, stay relevant and sustainable moving forward.

Finally, it is pleasing to see and report that the majority of Office Holders will be returning for another Season. I look forward to working with them and our members in Season 2018/19.

Director of Finance Report



Director of Finance Summary Season 17/18

Financially, this has been another big year for the club. The ongoing building works has meant a continuation of heightened cash flows in and out of the club. After consolidating funds across the club last year, we started the year in a stable position, with Stage 1 Building Works nearing completion. Our attention turned to fit out of Stage 1 (downstairs) to re-establish efficient lifesaving operations and subsequently, progressively commencing education, nippers, surf sports and all club activities. With considerable commitment from people right across the club, our core activities didn't miss a beat at the start of the lifesaving calendar.

With Stage 1 complete in October 2017, the focus shifted to Stage 2 (upstairs fit out). After considerable scoping, re-scoping, costing and re-costing and funding planning, a confirmed scope of works and budget was established. In the midst of project planning, we were successful in receiving a **\$348K SLS NSW Surf Club Facility Grant***. This is the second largest financial injection in our club's history and is a result of much hard work from Keith and his past and present committees. With funding for Stage 2 assured, the works can (and are being) carried out in an efficient manner with professional contractors, materially reducing risk to the club. Much thanks must go to club member Craig Parsons from LDJ Group for leading the project with his highly professional project management approach.

We were also successful and very grateful for receiving a Community Building Partnership Grant through local member Ryan Park for \$25K to complete a disabled toilets and facilities.

The buy-a-brick campaign has been well supported over the past few years. Generous members and supporters have donated in excess of \$73K. This generosity will be immortalised in a display inside the entrance to our new upstairs club facility. We look forward to the start of season 18/19 and showcasing the completed facility. It shapes to be a new era for the club – where we can look to sustainably set up the surf club for years to come.

We are very fortunate at Bulli Surf Club to have many great supporters and volunteering members. The committee would like to thank all our members who have donated their time to assist in our fundraising activities. Including donations and sponsorships, our main activities including the Bulli Workers Club raffle, Buy-a-brick and social functions contributed almost \$100K for the year. A special mention must go to our long standing principal sponsor, the Bulli Workers Club, without whose support our club could not serve the community as robustly as it does.

Over the 12 months to 31 May 2018, our cash position decreased ~\$28K, largely reflecting the timing of Stage 2 works completed and post year end draw down of the SLS NSW Facility Grant.





Notes to the Financial Statements

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act of New South Wales. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

(b) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

(c) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(d) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(e) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

(f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

(g) Investments

Investments held are originally recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs. They are subsequently measured at fair value which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.



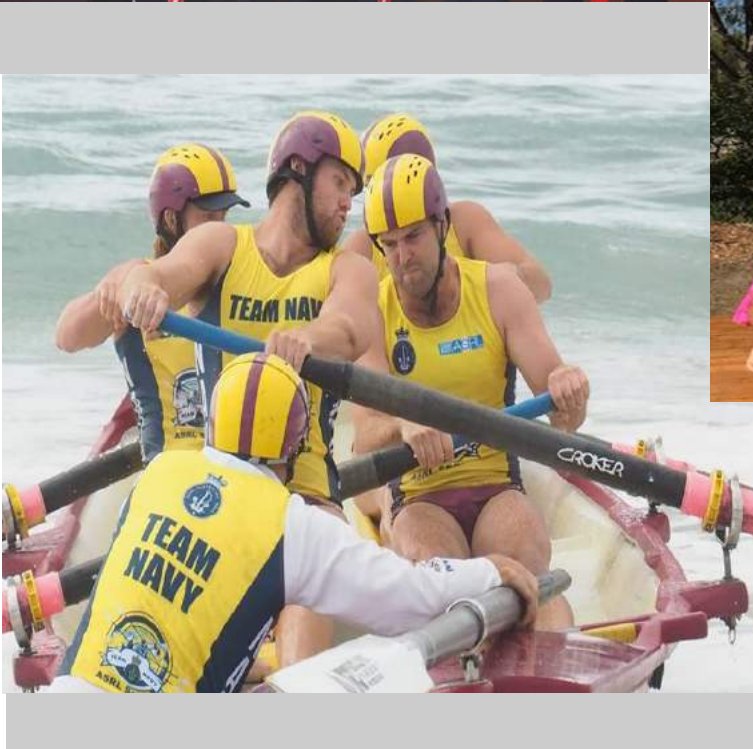

Director of Lifesaving Report



The patrol season for 2017 / 2018 has come and gone, and once again we as a group have kept intact our proud record of now 105 years of **'No lives lost during patrol hours on Bulli Beach'**.

A small breakdown of the 2017 / 2018 Patrolling Season is as follows: -

- Patrolling Hours Total: 4653 hours over 8 patrols (increase of 500+ hours)
- Rescues: 26 recorded. 16 with rescue boards, 5 with IRB, 4 with rescue tubes and 1 with no gear.
- First Aid's performed: 34
- Prevention's Recorded: 1641 (almost three times as many as three years ago)

I would like to personally thank every single Patrol Captain, Vice-Captain and member that has put on the red and yellow uniform this season and stood on our beach to protect the members of the public that has attended Bulli Beach and its surrounds, as it is you who this record belongs to. Well done one and all as it is truly a magnificent effort.

Bulli Surf Life Saving Club's ultimate goal is to provide the community with the best Surf Lifesaving Service on Bulli beach maintaining that no lives have been lost while Bulli SLSC is patrolling on Bulli Beach. As club we also provide supplementary to lifesaving opportunities for our whole membership base & the local community like junior activities, surf sports, development and education.

2017/2018 has seen another "huge" season pass by...ending with Bulli SLSC being announced as Surf Life Saving Illawarra Club of the Year. This is an outstanding achievement for our club and a reward to all members who have played a part in this season. Congratulations to all.

From my point of view as Director of Education I would like to thank the following people who have provided support and guidance including the whole executive & management committees but specifically Scott Gordon, Markus Meier-Lindner, Maria Caldwell, Dean Dudley, Nathan Flint, Keith Caldwell and Renee Sharman.

Overall this season including junior activities, Bulli SLSC delivered a total of 321 new education awards. We had increases of 133% on Surf Rescue Certificates, 30% on Bronze Medallions, 100% on IRB Drivers, 50% on Spinal Management and 100% on Advanced Resuscitation Techniques new awards compared to last season (2016/2017). These results are due to the whole team effort that Bulli SLSC is luckily enough to have as part of its day to day culture and is why our club is so successful across anything we do. Boat Captains Report



Season 2017/18 saw records tumbling in the boat section. The Open Men's crew of Shane Geloven, Dean Roberts, Heath Mercer, Ben Lowe and Fraser Worthington set a new record for most consecutive Open Boat NSW State Titles with their 5th straight win. It was also their 6th in 7 years. A tremendous achievement and one which I can't see being bettered in a long time. Similarly the Open Men's George Bass crew of Paul Jones, Albert Smeaton, Aron Davis, Kyle Mercer, Mitch Roberts, Iszak Lunney, Paul Barlow, Lachlan O'Grady and Adam Barlow won the George Bass and in turn Bulli became the first club to win 3 straight George Bass Marathons. Just take a moment to reflect on both of those achievements in one year. What makes it all the more significant is that 12 rowers and 2 sweeps contributed to this success. The names read like a family roll call with brothers galore and a lot of great Bulli names in that list.

Records aside, we won three gold medals at the NSW State titles and won multiple other carnivals. 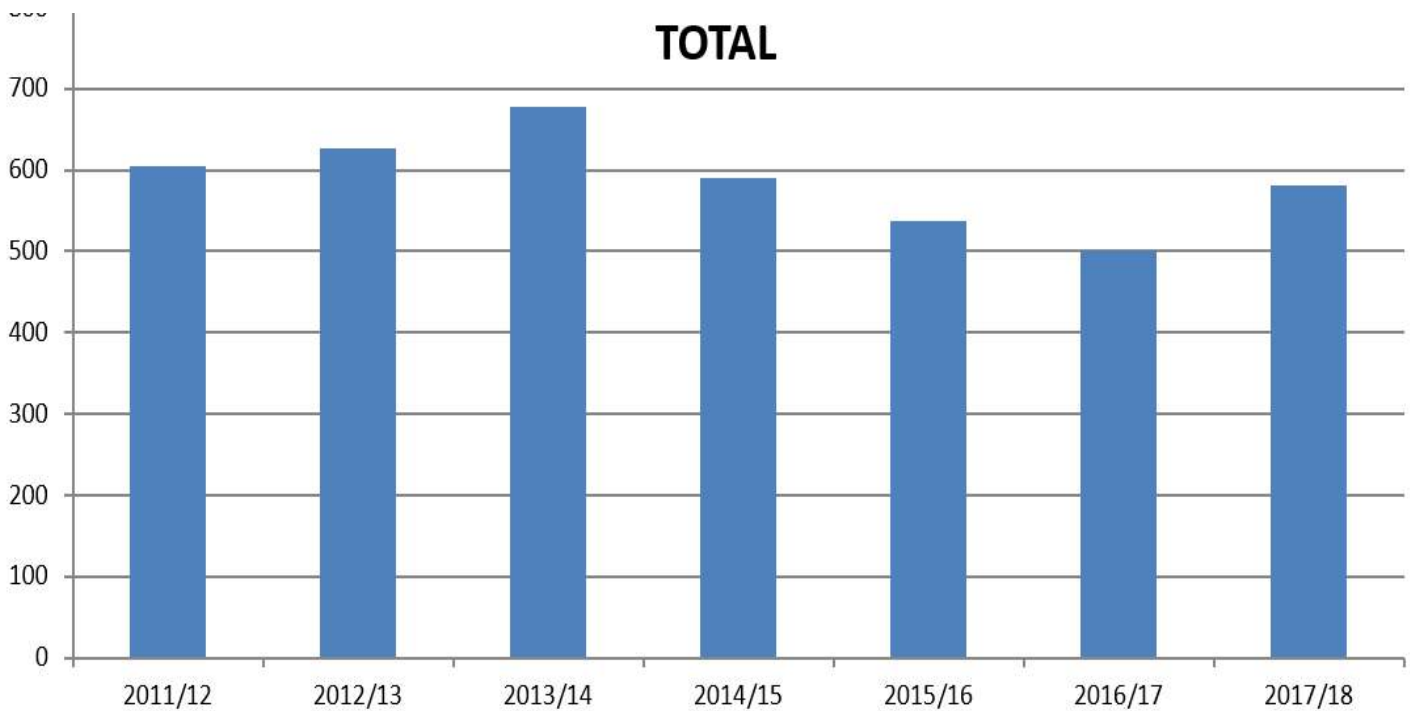

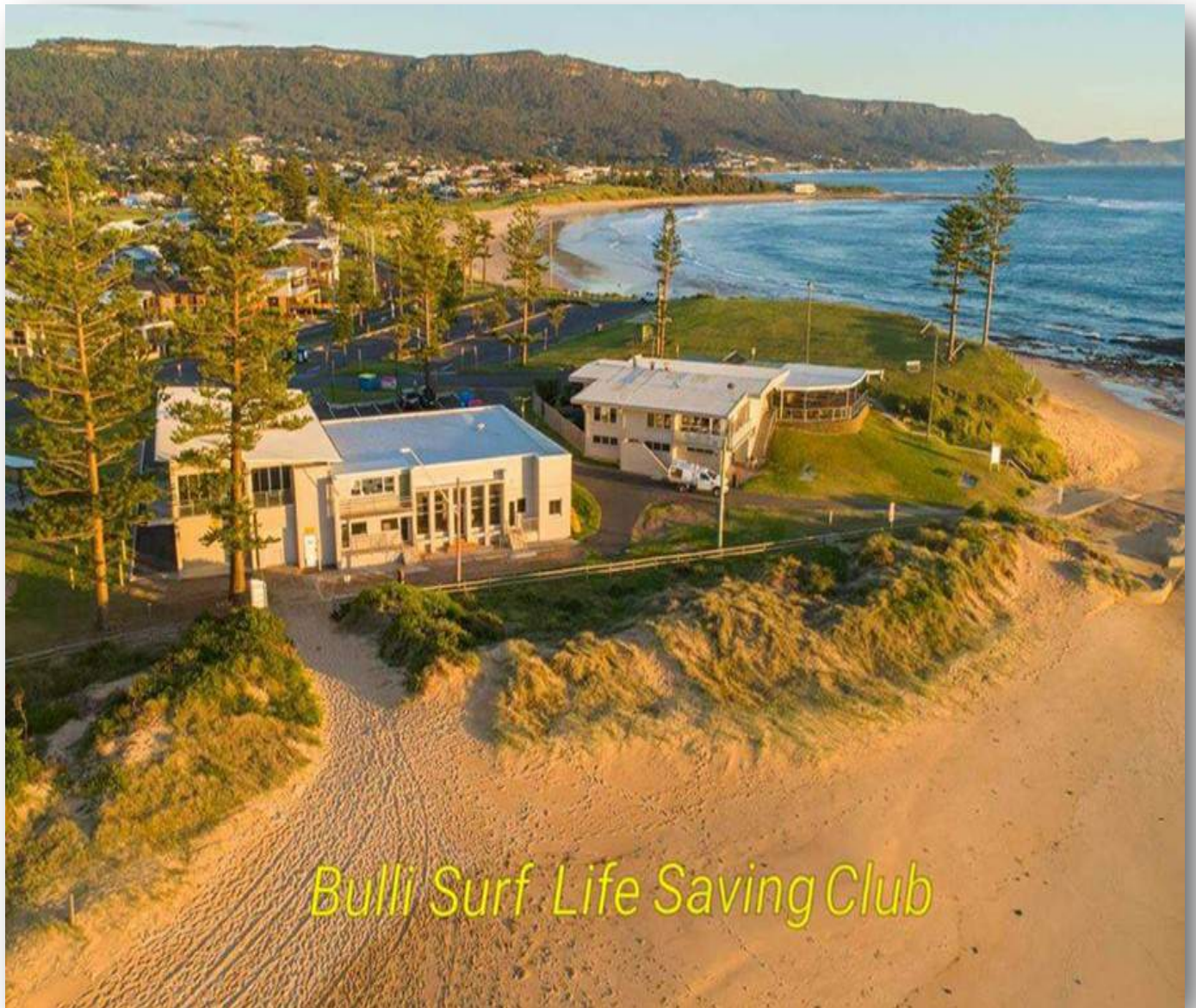
